## A Colorful Retreat

It doesn't matter what size your outdoor space is, it's about the pleasure it brings. And here we've designed a small spot filled with big color. Brimming with Caribbean flair, this sanctuary includes succulents and plants native to southern California as well as the bright blooms of Proven Winners annuals to add color, impact, and personality.

For a spot like this, the first step is to pick a color scheme. We created ours around the intense, three-in-one color of the new Luscious® Berry Blend Lantana in rich hues of pink, orange, and yellow. We expanded that color palette to include citrus and turquoise hues as well, creating a strong Caribbean style. We transformed existing pots, containers, and outdoor furniture using just a well-chosen color of paint and then used textured paint on the walls to create more warmth and style. We weathered the edges of the freshly painted windowbox, containers, table top, chairs, and room divider to add to the overall look and feel. The result is a personal retreat with an island vibe. Just add music and relax.

Add more of your own personality to your retreat space by including one-of-a-kind items that you enjoy and that show your style. Maybe it's a chicken from an antique shop, like the one shown here, or bright fabric pillows. Or maybe you have a variety of old brass candlesticks that could make a great new grouping when matched with brightly colored candles. It's also a perfect way to add soft light and maybe even fragrance to your sanctuary.

Blooms are the ultimate accessory, and just like a necklace or a purse, you can pick ones that either complement your outfit or make their own very colorful statement. ### Tip for Success

A little bit of planning goes a long way. Resist the temptation to buy every new plant that catches your eye or you will end up with a dizzying outdoor space that has no design. Go to the garden center with a rough plan, like three tall bright pink plants and three smaller white trailing plants for the full-sun patio containers. That way you have more than just a collection of plants that you like. You have a space that is well-designed and still conveys your personality.




















While there are many plants on the market that are sold as "blue," the majority are actually more purple than blue. That's because it's especially difficult to breed plants that are true blue.



# High on Hydrangea

Bright pastel colors, like Let's Dance® Big Easy Hydrangea, also stand out in a green landscape. The flower heads are large and lovely, so they are eye-catching even from a distance. Then come up close for an even more spectacular view. Grasses, like Desert Plains shown here, add a vertical, textured contrast that contributes to the garden design. And for the biggest impact, plant selections in large blocks, as you see here with Snow Princess® Lobularia, rather than mixing several plants evenly together.

### Tip for Success

While you're taking time to pick the right plants, don't overlook the importance of growing them in healthy soil. The best way to do that is to add compost, manure, or other organic matter to your soil to help it retain water and nutrients. And keep in mind the pH level of your soil as well. Alkaline soil and acidic soil have different properties that make it conducive for certain plants but not others and that can change the colors of Hydrangea blooms. Purchase a kit from a garden center to determine your soil's pH.

## The Great Outdoors

Whether you're in the North Woods or the Deep South, your garden design should always start with two considerations: the amount of light that surrounds your landscape and the conditions of your specific climate. You don't have to be an expert gardener or climatologist to know what will work best in your outdoor space, you just have to be sure to check plant tags.

If you have a shady front porch and a sunny patio, like the landscape shown here, you have lots of choices, but you still have to be sure you match the light requirements with the plant. You should also be aware of the hardiness zone that you live in, and, again, plant tags will provide the information you need to make a good choice.

With those parameters in mind, you can begin your search for color. Here you can see how effective a limited color palette can be. Not only do the plant choices complement the tones and architecture of the home, they also create intriguing bursts of color.

# The Great Outdoor Entertaining Space

Once you've picked the right plants, you can begin adding touches to your outdoor space that make it uniquely yours. In addition to planting some of your beautiful bloomers in traditional containers, you might want to consider unique items to serve as pots for your plants, like the small birch bark canoe or antique horse shown here. And don't forget that a little spray paint can give an old container a brand new look and can frame your plants in a way that better sets off their colors and complements the colors of the elements of your home, such as the brick, wood, or upholstery elements.



Match your plants to the amount of light in your space. Partial shade means three to six hours of sunlight; full sun means at least six hours. And don't forget there are shades of shade, too. Dense shade forms under a low, thick leaf canopy and light shade results from a higher, thinner leaf canopy.

Not So Extreme Makeover

When spring arrives, it's tempting to make big plans for your garden. But the makeovers don't have to be extreme to be extremely beautiful. In fact, experts suggest that your garden redesign will be more successful if you're realistic about the time you have available to maintain the makeover not just how much time you have to initiate it.

The garden bed makeover shown here, for instance, not only gives you a completely new look for your landscape, it's also a very manageable one-season project. Here are the four steps to success.

- 1. Select the space and remove existing plant material. Use a small garden tiller to break up sod, but be aware of buried utility lines before tilling. Cover the area with black plastic for up to a week to eliminate growth of any unwanted plant material.
- 2. Till the soil again at a deeper level, so it is ready for the roots of new plants. Amend the soil with compost or other organic material and add fertilizer. For this project, we used Proven Winners' heat-release fertilizer as we worked the soil.
- 3. Select your plants based on the light the area receives and the amount of space in the bed. You may also want to select perennials and shrubs to complement the fast color of annuals and to provide a framework for your landscape that will come back each year. If you choose to plant shrubs, be sure to leave plenty of space to accommodate for full-size growth over time.
- 4. Plant your bed and maintain it with regular weeding, trimming, and watering to establish the plants. Use water-soluble fertilizer for an extra boost. Mulching will help control weeds and hold moisture longer.



To make a great entrance, choose a container that complements the style of your entryway and plants that accentuate your color scheme. And remember to consider the amount of light at the outdoor entryway to your home when you choose your plants, so that they will thrive all season at your doorstep. Well-chosen containers help greet guests by creating the perfect first impression, but, most importantly, the plants you choose and the design you create is a beautiful expression of your own creativity.

### Tip for Success

When planting in containers or the landscape, keep in mind what the plant's tag says about its finished height. You might not believe that the small bloomers you pick up at the garden center can really grow as wide or as tall as the tag suggests, but they do. And if you haven't allowed for the space they'll need, they will be more susceptible to disease and pests.

# It's Easy to Do It Yourself

You don't have to buy a preplanted container to get great results. All you have to do is follow these easy steps and you'll have a combination that you'll be proud to say you grew yourself.

### Tip for Success

When should you water? For containers, it's best to soak them once a day, maybe twice in extreme heat. Landscape plants that are surrounded by mulch require about an inch of water each week. For both, water in the morning and near the roots rather than directly over the foliage of the plants.



Make sure the Proven Winners plants you select have the same light and water requirements. Purchase equal numbers of each – 2 each for a 14" container and 3 or more for larger containers.



Select a favorite container.

Make sure it has a drainage hole.

Fill it with a quality potting soil.

Add Proven Winners

time-release plant food.



Choose one variety and plant in opposite sides of the container.



Plant the second variety alternating with the first.



Fill in the container with the third variety. With time, water, and water-soluble Proven Winners plant food, your container will grow into a rich tapestry of color and texture.

# The Versatile Windowbox

Windowboxes aren't just for windows anymore. While they make beautiful additions under a sill, they can make an equally big statement when they sit atop a garden wall or along your porch steps. In fact, any blank space on your patio or deck can be the perfect spot for a windowbox or even two or three matching ones if you have a particularly large ledge or open area where you want to create more of a border. Your front door can benefit from well-placed windowboxes as well. Just remember before you fill them with plants to check that they have adequate drainage or be prepared to drill holes in the windowbox yourself.

## Top 12 Plants for Southern California

The Mediterranean climate of Southern California creates opportunities to grow plants that thrive in warm, dry summers and mild, wet winters. It also creates challenges, too — namely, finding the plants that match the climate. The 12 beauties shown here are popular with Southern California growers because they are reliable, easy-to-maintain bloomers for those fortunate enough to live in hardiness zones 9 and 10.

- 1 DAISY MAY® Leucanthemum superbum Full sun, Height: 12-24" Spread: 10-14" Beautiful 3-inch white flowers form a solid dome of bloom atop this compact and stunning Daisy.
- 2 THE RAVERS® Pink Sugar™ Arctotis hybrid Full sun to part shade, Height: 10-14" Spread: 16" Beautiful flower color, silver foliage, and a compact habit makes Pink Sugar a versatile addition to the garden.
- 3 ANGELFACE® Blue Angelonia hybrid
  Full sun, Height: 18-24" Spread: 10-12"
  A prized vertical accent plant, Angelface Blue is particularly compact, blooms early, and continuous to bloom even in the hottest conditions.
- 4 VOGUE® 'Rita' Mandevilla hybrid
  Full sun to part shade, Height: 18-48" Spread: 12-24"
  The most cold-resistant Mandevilla on the market, this beauty will produce an abundance of blooms. Its compact habit makes it an ideal choice for hanging baskets and any size container.
- 5 OVER EASY™ Calibrachoa hybrid Full sun to full shade, Height: 6-10" Spread: 18-24" The crisp white petals and prominent yellow throat are a unique combination that makes you look twice. A perfect complement with other Calibrachoas.
- 6 LUAU® 'Red Nalu' Hibiscus hybrid Full sun, Height: 24-36" Spread: 36" This Hibiscus boasts abundant floral displays, longer-lasting, vibrant red flowers, and rich green foliage.

- 7 LUAU® 'Lilikoi Yellow' Hibiscus hybrid
  Full sun, Height: 24-36" Spread: 36"
  The same great heat tolerance as Luau Red but with a unique coloration of yellow petals and a rich red throat.
- 8 GOLDILOCKS ROCKS® Bidens ferulifolia Full sun, Height: 12-14" Spread: 14-18" A unique semi-double bloom makes this plant spectacular, especially because it just keeps on blooming.
- 9 PINK CHABLIS® Lamium maculatum Full sun to full shade, Height: 8-12" Spread: 14" Trails to 24" Pink Chablis provides plenty of color and texture in areas of shade and sun. Apple green leaves with a dense silver overlay provide a stunning backdrop for the puffy, soft pink blooms.
- 10 SUPERTUNIA® Vista Bubblegum Petunia hybrid Full sun, Height: 16-24" Spread: 24" Trails to 60" This plant is bred to grow taller, spread wider, bloom longer, and grow more vigorously than any other Petunia. Plus, the bubblegum color is luscious.
- 11 Sunbird™ Tecomaria capensis Full sun, Height: 4-8' Spread: 4-8' Glossy green leaves lend a tropical effect in the landscape with rare canary yellow flowers hovering above the foliage. This plant can thrive even in sandy soil and hot conditions.

## Best Low-Water-Use Plants

Gardeners don't have to live without beautiful flowers just because they live in an area where local rainfall is low or where water restrictions are commonplace. In fact, the 11 plants shown here are perfect additions to a desert or low-water-use landscape. They're proof positive that dry conditions don't have to mean colorless gardens.

- 1 THE RAVERS® Pink Sugar™ Arctotis hybrid Full sun to part shade, Height: 10-14" Spread: 16" Beautiful flower color, silver foliage, and a compact habit makes Pink Sugar a versatile addition to the garden.
- 2 MOXIE™ Gold Chrysocephalum apiculatum Full sun, Height: 12-16" Spread: 16" Heat and drought conditions are no match for this beauty. Large, bright gold flowers sit atop well-branched, robust gray foliage.
- 3 CURIOUS® Orange *Mimulus aurantiacus*Full sun, Height: 12-18" Spread: 18"
  Great garden performance is the hallmark of this plant, along with large, beautiful, bright orange blooms that are long lasting.
- 4 LEMON DROP® Oenothera
  Full sun, Height: 8-12" Spread: 12" Trails to 24"
  Easy to grow, maintenance free, and heat tolerant, Lemon
  Drop is a glorious bloomer that requires little water.
- 5 Love Doctor™ Dianthus hybrid Full sun to part shade, Height: 2-4" Spread: 12-16" Blooms year around in temperate climates, forming tight mounds of dark green foliage and light pink blooms. Needs very little attention, although occasional deadheading will promote reblooming.
- 6 Witch Doctor™ Dianthus hybrid Full sun to part shade, Height: 2-4" Spread: 12-16" Same great characteristics of Love Doctor, but with a darker pink bloom color.

7 Star Struck™ Gaura hybrid Full sun, Height: 18-36" Spread: 12-24" Star Struck is a beautiful white bloomer with a superb habit that is ideal in any setting, from containers to the landscape.

8 Romeo™ Scaevola hybrid Full sun, Height: 4-6" Spread: 18" With tons of miniature, baby blue, fan-shaped flowers, Romeo is a great choice for hanging baskets as well as the landscape.

9 Sunbini Sanvitalia speciosa Full sun, Height: 6-10" Spread: 14" This plant fills out fast, without the need for much water, making it great in landscape beds in areas where drought is a concern.

10 INTENSIA® Blueberry Phlox hybrid Full sun, Height: 10-12" Spread: 12" Sweet fragrance, rich blue color, and easy maintenance make Intensia Blueberry a popular plant for those in drier regions of the country.

11 'Platinum Wallaby' Ptilotus hybrid Full sun, Height: 12-18" Spread: 18" A plant that boasts unique, long-lasting pink flowers with lavender undertones, Platinum Wallaby requires little water and little maintenance, which is why it will wow you.



## Top Plants for Northern California

The mostly temperate conditions of Northern California allow for a broad selection of plants that can accommodate a variety of conditions, which can make it challenging to determine which will grow best. Here are a few that Northern Californians can grow with great success. If you live in the northern part of the state but are in Hardiness Zones 9 and 10, you can also try plants listed for Southern California on pages 26 and 27.

### 1 PINK CHABLIS® Lamium maculatum

Full sun to full shade, Height: 8-12" Spread: 14" Trails to 24"

Pink Chablis provides plenty of color and texture in areas of shade and sun. Apple green leaves with a dense silver overlay provide a stunning backdrop for the soft pink blooms.

### 2 Love Doctor<sup>™</sup> Dianthus hybrid

Full sun to part shade, Height: 2-4" Spread: 12-16"

Blooms year around in temperate climates, forming tight mounds of dark green foliage and light pink blooms. Needs very little attention, although occasional deadheading will promote reblooming.

### 3 Witch Doctor™ Dianthus hybrid

Full sun to part shade, Height: 2-4" Spread: 12-16" Same great characteristics of Love Doctor, but with a darker pink bloom color.

### 4 SIMPLY SCENTSATIONAL® Heliotropium hybrid

Full sun, Height: 24-30" Spread: 14"

This plant combines the beauty and sweet fragrance of a Heliotrope with the heat and drought tolerance and exceptional performance of a Lantana.

### 5 GOLDILOCKS ROCKS® Bidens ferulifolia

Full sun, Height: 12-14" Spread: 14-18"

A unique semi-double bloom makes this plant spectacular, especially because it just keeps on blooming.

### 6 DAISY MAY® Leucanthemum superbum

Full sun, Height: 12-24" Spread: 10-14"

Beautiful 3" white flowers form a solid dome of bloom atop this compact Daisy.

### 7 SUPERTUNIA® Vista Bubblegum Petunia hybrid

Full sun, Height: 16-24" Spread: 24" Trails to 60"

This plant is bred to grow taller, spread wider, bloom longer, and grow more vigorously than any other Petunia. And the bubblegum color is luscious.

### 8 Flashbulb™ Lotus hybrid

Full sun, Height: 4-6" Spread: 12-18"

Unlike many Lotus varieties, which won't bloom unless night temperatures go down to 40°, Flashbulb will flower as long as night temperatures are below 60°.

### 9 JUICY FRUITS® Kumquat Nemesia hybrid

Full sun, Height: 8-12" Spread: 12"

Showy, dramatic bloomer is exceptionally cold tolerant and incredibly colorful. Great in borders, hanging baskets, and containers and an early bloomer.

### 10 SUNNY™ Olivia Osteospermum hybrid

Full sun, Height: 6-12" Spread: 12"

Big, bright blooms. That's what you can expect from Sunny Olivia. This plant blooms best under cool night conditions.

### 11 'Wendy's Wish' Salvia hybrid

Full sun, Height: 24-36" Spread: 36"

Deep fuchsia flowers are surrounded by mauve colored calyxes, and the deep green foliage has a well-branched habit, which sets the perfect backdrop for these amazing flowers.

### 12 Suntastic® Scaevola hybrid

Full sun, Height: 8-10" Spread: 18-24"

A versatile plant that works in windy, hot, and dry conditions, Suntastic features hundreds of small creamy yellow and white fan-shaped flowers.

### 13 Romeo™ Scaevola hybrid

Full sun, Height: 4-6" Spread: 18"

With tons of miniature, baby blue, fan-shaped flowers, Romeo is a great choice for hanging baskets as well as the landscape.









## How to Choose the Perfect Shrub


