Modeled after the magnificent Crystal Palace at the world-famous Kew Gardens in England, this iconic botanical garden was created in the late 1800s from the visions of extraordinary men including Frederick Law Olmsted, the "Father of American Landscape Architecture."

Upon opening in 1900, the conservatory was the third largest public greenhouse in the US and ninth largest in the world. It contained plants from around the globe collected by its director, John Cowell, who was considered by many to be a horticultural genius. In 1980, Erie County purchased the conservatory and 11.4 surrounding acres from the City of Buffalo and changed its name from South Park to the Buffalo and Erie County Botanical Gardens. In 1982, the Botanical Gardens were listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Today, over 100,000 people annually visit the Buffalo and Erie County Botanical Gardens to enjoy the amazing architecture and garden sanctuaries. It is a gathering place where visitors can find peace and harmony and enjoy the simple power of the natural world. Some visitors also see it as a place for spiritual healing, meditation and reflection.

Erie County and the Buffalo and Erie County Botanical Gardens Society created a public-private partnership in 2004 and the Society, a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization, operates the day to day operations. The Society's vision is to move towards a future where the lives of people of all ages are enriched by living plants of all kinds. They are committed to sustaining the wonders of earth's natural systems to ensure diverse plant life for future generations.

When you visit, you can't miss the Proven Winners Signature Garden which decorates the welcoming front entrance of the conservatory with masses of vibrant color, greeting guests with thousands of unique plants from spring through fall. The gardens are redesigned each year, so there's always something new to see.




