STEP 1

Color your pollinators and flowers.

STEP 2

Cut out on the dotted line.

STEP 3

Pollinators: Use tape to connect tab A to tab B.

Flower: Make your own flower garden by laying the colorful flowers on the floor.

STEP 4

Place loop of the pollinator on your finger or wrist and "fly" it to your flowers for a drink of nectar!

Butterflies, hummingbirds, songbirds and bees add wonderful movement and great interest to our gardens. Attracting these winged friends to your garden is a fairly simple matter. Provide them with food, water and shelter and they are happy to come and stay a while.


Fun Fact:
